## RESOLUTION NO. 29

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF DOVER, A MUNICIPAL CORPORATION OF THE STATE OF IDAHO, ESTABLISHING AN EQUITY BUY-IN VALUE FOR FUTURE SEWER CONNECTION FEES TO THE WASTE WATER TREATMENT FACILITY AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the new waste water treatment plant is operational; and

WHEREAS, duly approved funding for the construction of said treatment plant requires establishing utility fees capable of supporting operations, maintenance and debt repayment; and

WHEREAS, City Ordinance No. 47 establishes provisions for calculating and assessing various sewer facility charges; and

WHEREAS, the City Council, at a duly noticed regular meeting on April 13, 2000, considered calculations dated January 20, 2000 from the project engineer regarding establishing an equity buy-in value for future sewer connections to the waste water treatment facility;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the City Council of the City of Dover, County of Bonner, State of Idaho, that:

Effective May 2, 2000 the equity buy-in value for each sewer connection is hereby set at \$5,890.00 (five-thousand eight-hundred and ninety dollars).
