Lead Service Line Survey for Water

You may be receiving a survey to help us gather and report information for EPA compliance. Public water systems are required to complete an inventory of service lines. This survey plays a vital role in helping your public water system. Inventory development may require private property access or requests for information. Customer participation in surveys or information requests can help keep costs down. We thank you for your input.

Make sure you know where your water shut off valve to your home is located, in case of an emergency.

Stormwater run off

Many of you may have noticed the abundant surface water seemingly everywhere in Dover. Typical for this time of year, stormwater runoff as well as snow melt is slowing making its way to the river and can be found pooling in yards and near building foundations. City Staff would like to offer this friendly reminder that stormwater and snow melt are not allowed to enter the City's sewer system. Stormwater entering the sewer impacts the wastewater treatment plant. Please make sure yard drains, roof drains, sump pumps, and foundation drains are not connected to your septic tank. If you suspect stormwater is entering your house sewer drainpipe, contact the City for guidance to correct the issue.

The snowplows are working hard to clear the roads as quickly as possible on snow days. As a reminder, please do not move any snow berms in the middle of the road to clear your driveways. Let's keep everyone safe.
